

A New Era in the Protection of the Ozone Layer in India

1st August 2008 is a momentous day in the history of the Montreal Protocol in India when production of CFCs stops completely.

Let us celebrate and commemorate this historic day which comes **17 months ahead of phase-out deadline** with the assistance of the Multilateral Fund.



Production of CFCs Stops on 1st August 2008

As per the agreement reached between India and the international community, India has agreed to discontinue the production of CFCs.



National CFC Consumption Phase-out Plan for Refrigeration Service Sector
A project of the Government of India in collaboration with the Government of Germany, the Government of Switzerland, UNEP, UNDP and UNIDO

The 4 Indian producers of CFCs (SRF Limited, Gujarat Fluorochemicals Limited, Navin Fluorine Industries and Chemplast Sanmar Limited) will stop producing CFCs with effect 1st August 2008.

Imported and locally produced CFCs will not be available in the market from this date.

If you are a technician using CFC brands such as Floron, Refron, Mafron, Mettron these will no longer be available in the market.

- Use only recycled / reclaimed CFCs. Contact NCCoPP reclamation centers on how to obtain reclaimed CFCs (www.nccopp.info)
- Conserve CFCs by employing good practices.

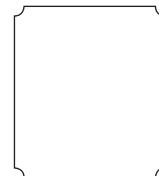
